HONORING OF LESLIE GABLER AFTER FOURTEEN YEARS OF SERVICE AS OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

At our Choir Cantata members of both the Chancel Choir and the Joyful Noise Choirs presented Leslie with gifts of appreciation. On December 27th the pastor announced that a collection was being taken up to

purchase a parting gift for our creative and gifted Music Director. Cancellation of church due to a snow blizzard on December 20th prevented the collection of sufficient funds to purchase her gift in time for the presentation. The gift was presented later, but it was announced on December 27th. The pastor offered prayers of thanksgiving on December 27th for Leslie's devoted service to our church community as evidenced in the choir cantatas, musical dramas, children musicals, and direction of the Chancel Choir, Joyful Noise Choir, Children's Choir, and Merry Methodist Women's Choir. She brought much creativity to her programs and demonstrated great skill in playing the organ and directing. Many went up and gave Leslie hugs on her last Sunday. That Sunday Leslie directed the Children's Musical Drama at 9:00 AM and the Chancel Choir and Joyful Noise Choir at the 10: 15 AM service.

Previously on the Second Sunday of Advent, Linda Warehime made the following announcement to the church: "The members of the Staff Parish Relations Committee would like to take this time to let all members and friends of the congregation know that as of December 31st 2009 Leslie Gabler has decided to step down as music director of Messiah. The committee has granted her a 6 month leave of absence with the right to reapply at that time.

With much devotion and prayer our committee is now in the process of searching for a new Music director, or organist/pianist and choir director to fill this vacancy. This is not an easy task. The committee is asking you the congregation for your love, prayers and support in helping us move forward in finding a new person to direct the music ministry for Messiah. While the committee is seeking a replacement for this position it would be helpful and greatly appreciated if anyone blessed with the gift and talent of music would help our church continue to have a strong music ministry.

Leslie, we also want to take this time to personally thank you for your years of music ministry to Messiah and the community. It has been a true blessing. The Staff Parish Relations Committee is asking for your prayers, love and support during this transition

We wish to pronounce over you the blessing Aaron spoke over the Israelites. This is found in Numbers 6: 24–27. 'May the Lord bless you and protect you, May the Lord smile on you and be gracious to you; May the Lord show you his favor and give you his peace.'"

THE STAFF-PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE let it be known to Leslie that she could have the six month leave of absence, and she could reapply for the position if it were still vacant. However, the church could not go without music for six months and would have to look for a new director if one could be found. It realized that most applicants might not be interested in a position that would only last six months.

After advertising in a number of newspapers and asking various college music departments to post signs indicating that we were looking for both a choir director and/ or a pianist or organist, we had a number of responses. No one was found who could both play organ and direct the choir. As a result, we had to hire two people instead of one, as we had previously been doing. We were pleased to have found Ann E. Bradley as our new Choir Director, and Aaron Burns as our new pianist, who were both able to start on January 1, 2010. The Staff Parish Relations Committee hired them on December 27th as they are empowered to do in the Discipline of the United Methodist Church. Ann and Aaron were introduced at our morning worship on January 3, and Ann gave a testimony concerning her faith and her calling by God to Music Ministry. Aaron will share concerning his faith and calling to music ministry on January 10th. Let me now share some information about them.



ANN E. BRADLEY, OUR NEW CHOIR DIRECTOR

Ann has had much experience directing choirs. Besides directing children and youth choirs from 1996–2008 at the Cathedral of the Resurrection at the Life in Jesus Community of the Charismatic Episcopal Church, she also directed

the adult choir of 23 members for approximately two years, and also sang in that choir and directed it when the regular director was not available. The Life in Jesus Community outside of Libertytown, Maryland recently disbanded. However for some decades it provided a rich liturgical and community life with three worship services each day. Ann was part of this religious community for twenty-five years. She plays piano and guitar, but she does not feel comfortable both playing and directing. Students have come to her for both guitar and voice lessons.

I talked to some who knew her in music ministry. They indicated that Ann is gifted in directing, and has a great knowledge of music. She can pull out gifts of others that she is directing. Many in the choir did not recognize that they had musical gifts until she encouraged them. She made choir directing more of a worship experience of giving back to the Lord. She knows vocal exercises such as singing scales to help the choir strengthen their voices for a particular song or to overcome weaknesses. She can even teach those tone deaf how to sing. She made musical exercises fun for the children, perhaps because she is used to working with children, since Ann and her husband Mark have six children.

Her Christian faith is very strong, and she is vocal about her faith. She prays about every thing. She knows the seasons of the church year and corresponding music. She has conducted classical music, Anglican chants, hymns, and praise worship.

A resident of the Homewood Retirement Community of Frederick and a member of Linganore United Methodist Church, indicated that Ann has had a paid position at the Homewood Retirement Community for six months. She has weekly choir rehearsals there and directs one Sunday a month. Therefore Ann was hired as our director with the understanding that she would need to be away the second Sunday of the month, but she will have rehearsed with our choir and will have Aaron ready to play and lead them on that Sunday. Full of energy, enthusiasm, and joy, Ann was able to take the choir at Homewood much further so they could do more difficult anthems than they were able to originally. There have been good reviews by the people in that congregation.

Ann received her Bachelor's of Science degree in Special Education (K–12) and in Elementary Education (K–6) from the University of Maryland, College, Park, graduating *Magna Cum Laude*, and her Master's of Science degree in Deaf Education from McDaniel College, graduating *Summa Cum Laude*. She was administrator and founder of the Life in Jesus Home School, 1993–2008 where she wrote and taught general music curricula for grades Kindergarten through 12. Also Ann served as a special education resource room teacher for the Frederick County Department of Education from 1981–1990. We welcome this multi-talented person to our church staff and thank God for sending her our way.

AARON BURNS, OUR NEW PIANIST

We were not able to find a trained organist, since very few people are studying organ these days, but we were delighted to find a piano student at McDaniel College who was interested in our job. He has known our new choir director all of his life, and has been trained by her. He will be able to play our keyboard with the organ sound. However, piano is definitely his instrument.

Aaron is a classically trained pianist who has been studying piano for thirteen years. He has extensive experience with classical music, church music, and some experience (one year) with jazz piano.

He lived in the Life in Jesus Community for twenty years and was extensively involved in the religious music and worship program there. He was very involved in the youth ministry. His experience at the Life in Jesus Community was heavily Christ-centered Aaron has performed extensively in solo recitals during his elementary, middle, and high school education as both a classical pianist and church pianist. During college, he performed in classical solo recitals, jazz ensemble recitals, and collaborative/chamber ensembles. He has played in master classes with such pianists as Ernest Ragogini and John Salmon, and spent time with these pianists to improve his knowledge, performance, and technique. In high school, Aaron had the opportunity to work with a visiting group from the Yong Siew Toh conservatory in Taiwan. He performed and was critiqued, and also critiqued other performers.

In the summer of 2009 Aaron worked with the McDaniel orchestra camp led by Lynn Fleming. Aaron worked as assistant piano instructor to Dr. David Kreider, Professor of Music at McDaniel College and Music Director at the Ascension Episcopal Church in Westminster. He spent time teaching half-hour lessons and also helped students to improve practice habits by conducting one-on-one practice sessions. He also performed collaborative and solo pieces in a workshop for the piano students.

From 1996 till 2005 Aaron studied with classically trained pianist Joan MacDonald. She received a bachelor's degree in music from Western Maryland College. She was also a church pianist and organist at the Cathedral of the Resurrection. She has extensive experience with the piano and organ, as well as in the field of religious music composition. From 2005 to present Aaron studied with Dr. David Kreider. Dr. Kreider received his bachelor's and master's degrees in piano performance at the Peabody Conservatory. He received his doctorate in piano performance from Catholic University in D.C. He presented a debut recital in Carnegie Hall, NY and has performed extensively both in the U.S., and internationally.

Aaron intends to pursue a master's degree in piano performance and wants to perform music professionally when he has finished with his education.

Besides having interests and talents in music, Aaron played football at McDaniel College for two years and has finished his final season. He also has taken fencing lessons and martial arts in Frederick. He was involved in the Knights of the Cross Youth program where young men progressed from pages, to squires, to knights. This involved athletic and spiritual development. In the Youth Group at Life in Jesus Community he handed out food to the needy, went caroling, went on a mission trip to help hurricane victims in New Orleans after Katrina. He has been baptized and confirmed. He has two older brothers. He is a member of *Beta Alpha Chi*, the Music Honor Society at McDaniel College. Aaron's family lives in Finksburg, but he has an apartment room in Westminster to be close to McDaniel College.

TITHING BY DOTTY LYDARD

Malachi 3:10

"Bring the full tithe into the storehouse so that there may be food in my house and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of Hosts, and see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing."


