We often pray for miracles and then are disappointed when we don't get what we want. But God always answers our prayers. Maybe just not in the way we Today's Gospel has an account of 2 very dramatic miracles. God, however usually works in more subtle ways. I read a story of a young girl who had a serious accident. People from all over the world were praying for her. Her parish community gathered daily to pray. The child died within weeks of the accident. But her biological family and her faith family still had a miracle. They experienced the love and faith of thousands of people that they would have never have had contact with before. This girl had a great effect on the lives of so many people. What a miracle. Take time this week to recognize the many miracles (big and small) that occur in your life every day. Find a way to express your gratitude to God for these miracles.

Prayer Pointers from Sheila Garcia, Associate Director, Secretariat for Laity, Marriage, Family Life and Youth, USCCB (continued from last week):

- 3. Pray as a family. Build upon rituals such as grace before meals. Encourage family members to offer thanks for the blessings of the day and prayers for those in need. Couples can take a few minutes, perhaps before bedtime, to commend to God the day's joys and sorrows
- 4. Decorate your domestic church. Create an atmosphere for prayer in your home-the domestic church-by displaying a crucifix, icons, the Bible and other holy objects. Take the children to a religious goods store and let them choose a picture or statue for their rooms.
