From Barbara...

If we ever needed to show someone that God has a violent side to him we need go no further than today's Gospel. Jesus is very graphic about the need to stay true to his mission. I am personally glad that we've gotten away from corporal punishment. But God's love for us is so great that nothing can keep us from it. We are blessed to have so many ways to rectify our wrongs and to make things right with God and others again. Today's Psalm says it all "The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart." Take time this week to find the joy of the Lord in your everyday life.

As flu season is upon us we've put hand sanitizer at the entrance of each worship space and on the credence table for the Eucharistic Ministers and the priest to use before and after they distribute communion. For the next several weeks I will be putting some recommendations from the medical community that have been sanctioned by the Archdiocese regarding precautions to take to avoid the flu. The first is: The flu season is starting. More than one kind of flue virus will be spreading this season, including seasonal flu and the 2009 H1N1 (Swine) flu. If you get the flu, you can easily spread it to others. Please follow the recommendations of the CDC and your local health department for everyone's safety: Wash your hands often, cover your mouth with a tissue or arm if you sneeze or cough, get a vaccination when available, stay home when you fell sick. This includes staying home from Mass when you are sick. Please note that you are absolved from the obligation to participate in Mass on Sunday when you are ill, or caring for someone who is ill. You can make a spiritual communion spending dedicated time with God in private prayer.
