Update on Haiti

As of today (Jan. 18) the news that we have from our sister parish, St. Martin de Porres, is relatively good. They are located about 75 miles north of Port-au-Prince where the epicenter of the earthquake occurred. There is very little if any structural damage to the buildings. The people in Gonaives are safe. Sadly, some of the parishioners did perish as they were studying in Port-au-Prince. Fr. Jean Eugene Webert, the pastor of St. Martin, is in touch with us and will keep us informed.

Last week we donated the poor box proceeds to the general relief efforts in Haiti. If you wish to contribute now please send it directly to the Archdiocese of Baltimore (320 Cathedral Street, Baltimore, MD 21201) and mark your check and the outside of the envelope *"Haiti relief fund"*. We will wait to see if there are any additional needs as time goes on.

This will be a very long process of recovery and I'm sure they will appreciate our contributions at any time especially since so much is being contributed now. In the meantime, please keep all the people of Haiti in your prayers as well as the rescue workers as they continue to suffer the effects of this tragic natural occurrence.
