# Catholic Social Thought in an Era of Political Division

Monsignor Stuart W. Swetland, S.T.D. (who currently serves as the Archbishop Harry Flynn Chair of Christian Ethics, and Director of Pre-Theology, Mount St. Mary's University) will present a seminar on the Church's social teachings at 7:00 pm on Thursday, May 13, at St. John the Evangelist Community Center Hall, 114 E. Second St., Frederick. Monsignor Swetland's presentation will cover Pope Benedict XVI's latest encyclical "Caritas in Veritate," which reflects on the Church's teaching about social justice, economics, the environment, development and politics, especially in light of the economic crisis gripping much of the world. The cost is \$5. This is the final presentation in our 2009-2010 lecture series "Social Teachings of the Church: What We Believe and How We Live It."

# From Barbara...

We have all experienced separation from a loved one. Sometimes it's a temporary separation when people move for a job or go away to college. Sometimes it's permanent as through death. It can be a very difficult time. So, we can all identify with the Apostles as Jesus was preparing them for his leaving. But we too have been prepared for this separation. We know that God sent us the Holy Spirit to be with us always. And throughout Scripture we are told what is expected of us as Christians. Take time this week to live up to your baptismal promises and live out the creed that we profess each week together.

Throughout the years there have been some changes made as to how we receive communion. Here's a quick refresher on proper communion etiquette. The reception of Holy Communion should be done with prayerful reverence. It is a communal gesture so we should all be doing relatively the same thing. We each approach the Minister of Communion in a prayerful posture with hands folded. As the person before us is receiving communion, one should make a small bow of respect to the Blessed Sacrament. Please do not genuflect at this time. Reception of the consecrated host can be in your hands or on the tongue. If you receive on your tongue, please be sure to extend your tongue fully so the host can be placed without falling. If you receive in your hands you should place your dominant hand under your other hand to form a throne upon which the host will be placed. Then use your dominant hand to put it in your mouth and consume immediately. receiving from the sacred cup, take the cup from the minister with both hands and drink. Do not intinct (dip) the host into the cup. Intinction is only done when a priest is administering communion using a special vessel to avoid drips. Then return to your seat again with hands folded. If you are not receiving communion and wish to receive a blessing, please come forward and place your hands across your chest. The priest or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion will give you a blessing. primarily for children who are not of age or for adults who are unable to receive communion. Since Mass is not yet finished we should not leave Mass until we are dismissed ("The Mass is ended. Go in Peace."); or even more appropriately after the recessional song has finished. If you are an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and are taking the Eucharist to someone who is homebound, you should place the pyx on the altar before Mass. Father will place a consecrated host in the pyx and leave it on the altar. You can pick it up after Mass. Sometimes the priest may call you forward and give you a special blessing when sending you forth from the community. No one should be taking the Eucharist home to someone unless they are an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Receiving the Eucharist under both forms was restored after Vatican II and is a fuller way to experience the sacrament. Jesus told us to "eat and drink." I hope that you find this helpful. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

May God continue to bless us all. Alleluia! Alleluia!
