

# From Barbara...

A few weeks ago I went to New York City with a friend to see a show. We saw "The Addams Family" based on the cartoon series by Charles Addams and of course the TV show of the same name. I was struck by one of the songs in the show called "One Normal Night." It's sung by 2 young people in the cast wishing that each of their families were "normal." (I think this is actually the anthem of most adolescents.) A catch phrase from the show is "define normal." The early Christians must have felt much the same way. The Apostles, who have been hovering in fear for the last 50 days, suddenly find the courage to walk out to the crowded streets of Jerusalem to preach a new message. That's not *normal!* People from all over the known world were listening to them and understood them in their own language. That's not normal! Jesus had died yet he appeared before them in the flesh. That's not normal! But is it? Over 2 thousand years later we still preach that same message of love. We still have people from all over the known world trying to understand and live that same message. Many of us still fear talking about our faith. Define normal! Take time this week to find your normal and see how it resonates with the faith of the church. You may find that "normal" isn't what it used to be.

I hope that you are going to join us for the Volunteer Appreciation Picnic on June 5. Last year it was great fun. No need to RSVP, just show up and get a chance to socialize with your fellow parishioners. We will have lots of food, family friendly entertainment with a magician/juggler, and fabulous conversation.
